Herwig Turk & Gebhard Sengmüller Danube:Island 23.2. to 5.5.24

Industrial zone, local recreational area and sensitive ecosystem – the Danube is a reconfigured cultural landscape marked by stark contrasts. The Austrian artists Herwig Turk and Gebhard Sengmüller have chosen this as the starting point for their artistic research: as part of their project *Danube: Sediment Shifts in Interstitial Space* they have created a complex of works, originally conceived for Vienna, at the interface of art and the natural sciences. These are now being augmented for the exhibition by geographical, ecological and historical aspects of the city of Linz. Using the island as an artistic figure of thought, Turk and Sengmüller combine historical realities – such as the Strasserinsel, which existed in Linz until the 19th century – with current socio-political discourses on the utilisation of the Danube region by means of an artificial island.

Videos, installations, photographs and sculptural objects allow an intensive exploration of the river and its relevance for mankind and the environment. The works shown in the exhibition create a multidimensional, dynamic landscape and interweave different thematic fields into a dense visual narrative

CV Artists

Gebhard Sengmüller is an artist working in the feld of media technology, based in Vienna, Austria. Since 1992, he has developed projects and installations focussing on the deep background of electronic media, retroactively changing the timeline of media history, dissecting and recombining media technologies, and constructing autogenerative systems and networks. His work has been shown extensively in Europe, the Americas and Asia, among others in venues such as Ars Electronica Linz, the Venice Biennale, the Institute of Contemporary Arts London, Postmasters Gallery NYC, the Museum of Contemporary Photography Chicago, the microwave Festival Hong Kong, or the InterCommunication Center Tokyo (gebseng.com).

Herwig Turk lives and works in Vienna. His projects probe the interconnectivity of the felds of art, technology and science. Since 2016 he has been conducting artistic research on the Tagliamento River in Northern Italy and other river systems. From 2010 to 2013 he was Artist in Residence at IMM (Instituto da Medicina Molecular) Lisbon. From 2003 to 2009, Turk collaborated with Paulo Pereira, head of the ophthalmology department of IBILI (Institute for Biomediacal Imaging and Life Sciences, Coimbra). In recent years, his works have been shown at the MMKK Museum Moderner Kunst Kärnten in Klagenfurt, the MAK Museum für angewandte Kunst in Vienna, the Seoul Museum of Art in South Korea, the Neues Museum Weserburg in Bremen, the Museum Sinclair Haus in Bad Homburg, the TESLA Labor für Medienkunst in Berlin, the Galerie rauminhalt_harald bichler in Vienna, the Galerie Georg Kargl in Vienna, and the Transmediale in Berlin, among others.
